You can check out lots of information about the artists, including tour information, photos, links and biographies. You can also watch concerts near your location and listen to other people's playlists that can help you discover new artists or hits

Spotify is a music, podcast and video streaming service that was officially launched on October 7, 2008. It is the most popular and used streaming service in the world. It is developed by startup Spotify AB in Stockholm, Sweden.

Provides content protected content provided with digital rights management restriction of recorders and media companies. Spotify is a freemium service; with basic resources being free with advertisements or limitations, while additional resources, such as improved streaming quality and music downloads, are offered for paid subscriptions.

Spotify is available in most of Europe, part of America, Australia, New Zealand and parts of Asia. It is available for most modern devices, including Windows, MacOS and Linux computers, as well as iOS, Windows Phone and Android smartphones and tablets. Songs can be browsed or searched by artist, album, genre, playlist, or recorder.

Users can create, edit, or share playlists, share tracks on social media, or make playlists with other users. Spotify provides access to over 30 million songs. In April 2019, it had more than 217 million active users, including 100 million subscribers.

Spotify pays royalties based on an artist's number of auditions as the total proportion of songs heard on the service, as opposed to physical sales or downloads, which pay artists a fixed price for the music or album sold. They distribute approximately 70% of total income to rights holders, who then pay artists based on their individual agreements.

Spotify is very similar to YouTube, it works with an algorithm, it has a job and it is to provide you music and will always try to keep you satisfied when you are using the Spotify app. If you are not yet familiar with Spotify and doubt yourself how to use it, we can give you some practical advice. Spotify is a fast and reliable app and this is based on the fact that most of its actions are handled through Google Cloud. Leveraging great redundant cloud service as well as storing your files in OGG Vorbis that takes up less space than mp3 while maintaining quality has given Spotify a reputation for being a fast and reliable streaming app.

For example, let's say you're looking for the profile of a very popular musician you want to hear. Search for your name or the name of the band and you can see their profile; the first thing you can see is a banner that opens up a bit and check the "Overview" and look for the latest version, then you can look for some other things like merge (you can click the merge on Spotify) which can then find the collections of albums by this artist.

The next button is "Fans Like It," where you can discover more artists again based on the algorithm technology Spotify uses in the backend. Let's say this is the result of calculating the musical preferences of your fans. In other words, you can get helpful recommendations for artists of the same or similar genre.

Then after that, you can click on the "About" section. There you can find more images or you can read the biography and read paragraphs with more information about the artist. Today, it's all about the community, and fans really need to understand more about their favorite musicians - who they are and what they represent. Of course, you can find links to other social media accounts from them.

By scrolling down, you can find the related playlist where your songs are displayed. Therefore, this playlist can play an important role in your search for today's best hits. Not only this, but more and more information can be found there, such as tour locations or future concerts.

With all this, you can imagine how creatively this application can be used. It doesn't matter if you are an artist or just a music fan, you can find even more interesting things there. Some people also post their podcasts on the platform where they discuss some topics (many artists use Spotify for their podcasts).
